

# COVID-19 CHECKLIST

This checklist is to help employers, employees and the self-employed in the UK understand how to work safely during the COVID-19 pandemic.

## RISK ASSESSMENT

- COVID-19 operational risk assessment has been completed

## SOCIAL DISTANCING

- Clear signs have been placed throughout the workplace to encourage 2m social distancing and hand washing including entrances and exits
- Areas have been identified where there is likely to be a cluster of people and use 2m social distance markings
- An internal one-way system has been created for any aisles less than 2m, keeping emergency exits and fire doors closed
- Social distancing has been applied to all parts of the business, not just the place where people spend most of their time

## PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

- PPE has been distributed with guidance on use and disposal facilities in place
- Reusable PPE is thoroughly cleaned after use and not shared between employees
- Single use PPE is disposed of so that it cannot be reused
- Process has been set for secure storage and issue of PPE and cleaning products

## COMMON AREAS

- Parking - clear signs in parking areas to maintain the social distancing standard
- Canteens - identify the capacity of each canteen/rest area at the entry of each facility
- Staggered breaks if needed to reduce the number of people in the area
- Number of chairs minimised to maintain 2m rule
- Only one person is allowed in the elevator at one time

## TOILET FACILITIES

- There is now a restricted number of people using the toilet facilities at one time
- Hand washing facilities are being cleaned regularly
- Paper towels are available in the wash room

## HYGIENE

- Cleaning stations are now in place to enable employees to clean, including visual aids, instructions on use and waste disposal facilities
- Processes are now in place for enhanced cleaning of all touch points
- Hand washing facilities or sanitisers are now provided at entrances and exits
- Adequate supplies of soap/water are now available

## OFFICES

- Home working is now being utilised
- Number of employees in the office is now reduced
- Number of meeting rooms available is now minimised
- Rooms have now been labelled to identify maximum number of people allowed inside
- Desks, floors or signs are now in place to highlight the importance of social distancing

## SITE ACCESS

- Number of visitors/contractors on site has been reduced to manage and minimise risk
- Start and finish times are now staggered to reduce worker contact and bottlenecks
- Processes are now in place for the management of deliveries to minimise contact with other people whilst loading and unloading
